Elaine Fluet, CEO of the Gardner VNA, was recently awarded the Worcester Business Journal's 2nd Annual 2010 Women in Business Award. This award is given to remarkable women who are making their mark on the Central Massachasetts business



community. Elaine was one of 6 honored out of many nominated. According to Board Chairman, Debbie Orre, it really didn't surprise anyone that her leadership has been noticed and awarded. "We all know how tirelessly Elaine works on the agency's behalf and how innovative a leader she is, which has enabled the Gardner VNA to remain a strong and financially solvent agency," said Orre. Fluet was featured in an article in the Worcester Business Journal on November 8 and received her award at a luncheon in Worcester on November 19.

"Elaine started her career with the Gardner VNA in 1985 and ultimately became the Chief Executive Officer in 2004," said Orre. "Under her leadership, the Gardner VNA has become an 8.8 million dollar operation with a solid financial future," she said. National Home Care Month Celebration

The Gardner VNA joined home health providers across the state and country this past November to mark National Home Care Month. The Gardner VNA is working to raising awareness of the services they provide as a cost-effective solution to help improve care delivery.

"We are very proud of our work that enables patients to remain in the most comfortable and familiar setting: their own homes," said Elaine Fluet, CEO. "The Gardner VNA is honored to help patients remain independent and close to their loved ones."

Nationally, more than 11 million Americans receive home health care, according to the National Association for Home Care & Hospice. In Massachusetts, more than 170 member agencies of the Home Care Alliance provide over 5 million home care visits each year to approximately 175,000 elderly, mentally ill and otherwise infirm Massachusetts residents.

Through technological advances, home-delivered healthcare has grown far beyond basic professional nursing and home care aide services. The Gardner VNA offers a wealth of services from nursing, physical &

occupational therapies to hospice, adult day health centers, telehealth (remote patient monitoring), lifeline/medication management, private duty and personal care services.

"So many emerging health care reform efforts play to our member agency strengths," said Home Care Alliance of Massachusetts Executive Director Patricia Kelleher. "Efforts at reducing readmission rates to hospitals and new state programs aimed at managing chronic illnesses can look to us for help and support."

Massachusetts is at or better than the national average in OASIS scores (Outcome and Assessment Information Set), which is the data collection tool used to gather important information on home health agencies and their performance. Among the areas where the state exceeded the average was improving patients mobility, reducing pain, properly taking medication, improving or healing wounds from an operation and having patients remain at home after home health services ended.

Hospice Program Hosts Annual Celebration of Life Service

On Sunday, November 7, the Gardner VNA Hospice Program hosted their Annual Celebration of Life service at Cornerstone Church on route 140 in Winchendon. "The celebration is in remembrance of all Gardner VNA Hospice patients who have passed away over the last 15 months," according to Carol Salmi, Hospice Director.
